CHC40213 Certificate IV in Education Support

Develop your career as a Teacher Aide

Do you want to be a:

- Teacher Aide
- Help out at a school
- Contribute to the development of children
- Support learning or
- Start on a pathway to becoming a teacher?

This qualification is for anyone wishing to commence a career as a teacher aide or as an education support worker. You can have your experience recognised to gain a qualification or you can progress through to a Diploma or a Degree in Education.



This qualification reflects the role of workers in a range of education settings, including public and independent schools and community education settings, who provide assistance and support to teachers and students under broad-based supervision.

Some job roles may require tasks to be performed with a moderate level of autonomy and/or the provision of supervision/leadership to other staff/volunteers.

What will I learn?

Topics covered in this course include:

- Support the development of literacy skills
- Support students with disabilities and additional needs in the classroom environment
- Assist in the facilitation of student learning
- Support behaviour of children and young people
- Supervise students outside of the classroom
- Deliver elements of teaching and learning programs

How is it delivered?

This course is available through the following options:

- **Face-to-face training** is offered through fortnightly workshops, self-paced study, vocational placement and tutorial support.
- **Distance training** is delivered through blended learning including self-paced study using workbooks and supported with phone and email tutorial support. A range of options are available to best suit your learning style.

Course Requirements

To gain entry into CHC40213 Certificate IV in Education Support, students require validated experience in direct learning support under limited guidance as an education support worker, childhood educator, early childhood educator or similar role, or successful completion of Certificate III in Education Support or a similar qualification.

Recognition of Prior Learning

Your history of life and work experiences as well as formal and informal training may be applied using the Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) process. All students are offered RPL upon enrolment or commencement of training. Documentary evidence will be required.
